The train goes right into the centre from where you can walk to many attractions including Edinburgh Castle, the Royal Mile, Holyrood Palace, Arthur's Seat, Prince's Street Gardens, the National Gallery of Scotland and the main shopping area. Explore Perth - Scotland's Fair City

You'll be spoilt for choice! Perth Museum and Art Gallery, the Black Watch Museum, St John's Kirk, St Ninian's Cathedral and Perth Leisure Pool (with flumes and wild water) are all close to the town centre. If you feel like fresh air then explore the riverside, Sculpture Trail, Rodney Gardens and the North and South Inch. For a longer walk, Kinnoull Hill has excellent views and many trails. If the weather is bad, relax in the seven screen cinema, theatre or shops. West to Comrie, The Shaky Toun

Comrie lies on the Highland Fault Line and earned its nickname after experiencing earth tremors as far back as the 16th century. All is quiet today however and you can choose from 6 lovely way marked walks (leaflet available from Crieff Tourist Information Centre or local shops). The Glen Lednock Circular Walk is one of the best and it starts from the village centre. For a more relaxed time try a picnic on the banks of the River Earn or afternoon tea in one of the popular tearooms or hotels.

View from Kinnoull Hill, Perth

One of Perthshire's most beautiful lochs

Situated in the far west of Perthshire, Loch Earn is surrounded by high hills and lies within Scotland's first National Park. Walks are plentiful in this scenic area. Above the small village of St Fillans walkers can enjoy woodland, moorland and great views in Glen Tarken. (The walk is easy to follow and starts on the small road just behind the wooden bus shelter. (OS Landranger Map 51) Or enjoy a pleasant stroll around the village and along the quiet south shore road, which has many idyllic picnic spots by the water. Three lochside hotels serve lunches and refreshments. Enjoy superb Scottish cooking with real flair at the **Achray House Hotel** and get a **10% discount off your lunch bill (excluding drinks) on presentation of this leaflet and your current bus ticket.**

At Comrie

Discover the Royal Burgh of Stirling

The atmospheric Old Town is bursting with history. Visit Stirling Castle, perched on a rocky crag, this is one of the grandest castles in Scotland and you should allow at least half a day to get round. Nearby, on the Castle Esplanade, is the Royal Burgh of Stirling Visitor Centre which has an exciting multi-lingual audio-visual presentation on the town. Learn about the horrors of prison life in the Old Town Jail or, for something more genteel, take a tour of Argyll's Lodging, a restored 17th century mansion house. For art lovers there's the Tolbooth Arts Centre and Smith Art Gallery and Museum.
